Workshops can be set-up for up to 16 participants depending on the space you have available.

I can travel to you, or you can come to me (maximum of 10 participants in my studio space pictured here).



Professional watercolor supplies - what you see here - are all included with your workshop experience.

The floral wreath pictured in the corner will be provided to you as a template to guide your process.



I lead fully-guided tutorials at four points during the lesson.

The first tutorial guides you through color mixing, water-to-paint ratios, and color palettes.



The remaining tutorials begin with a brief sketch before we capture the full imagery in paint.

Greenery is the most basic approach so we start with these pieces.



Each tutorial will include a brief introduction to technique.

Greenery practice uses the wet-on-dry technique and a simple color palette of blue and yellow hues.



The most complex technique we will cover is the wet-on-wet color blending technique pictured here.

We use this technique to design the florals you see in the wreath.



The final tutorial will include placement strategies and focal points for your final wreath.

You have all the skills! Now we shrink them down, focus on detail, and design a unified color palette.



Throughout the workshop you are encouraged to ask questions. My workshops are very hands-on and suitable for all learner levels!



All final pieces look different and capture each student's unique perspective and characteristics.
